CURRENT PROGRAM MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

As Executive Director of IIFET and Director of the NAAFE Business Office, I am responsible for carrying out the day to day management of two professional organizations, including financial management and fundraising. In addition, I advise the elected boards of directors of the organizations on future directions and policy. Sample areas of responsibility include:

Conference Organization: The IIFET Secretariat/NAAFE Business Office is responsible for developing and carrying out plans for both internal and external international communication and marketing for our conferences. In addition I identify, research, and assist potential conference organizers through the competitive bidding process, coordinate communication with the Executive Committee or Board of Directors, and advise the boards on candidate selection. Recently, identifying, reviewing and selecting potential sources of technical expertise to develop online conference abstract submission and registration processes has provided a new focus. In addition I compile and publish some conference proceedings. On some occasions, I participate in

a full range of conference organizing activities, working with professional conference organizers, program chairs, scientific committees, and other groups to plan and implement conferences.

Publishing/Communications: I am responsible for developing, publishing, and distributing series, newsletters, electronic media, and printed documents on marine economics for IIFET and NAAFE, including the IIFET electronic list and online membership directory, the *IIFET Newsletter* (a biannual publication providing information on conferences, publications, activities, research programs, and institutions of interest to marine economists). I have compiled and published several IIFET conference proceedings.

Management: I plan, carry out, and oversee the daily administration and oversight of two international professional associations for fishery economists, including budgeting, financial management and reporting, fundraising, maintenance of membership databases and other lists, billing, elections of board members, public relations, membership recruitment and retention, facilitating collaborative networking among members, and other membership services and activities.
